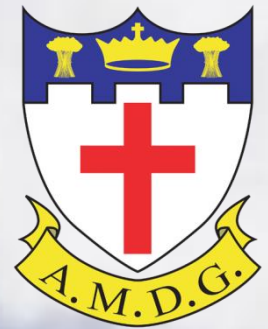

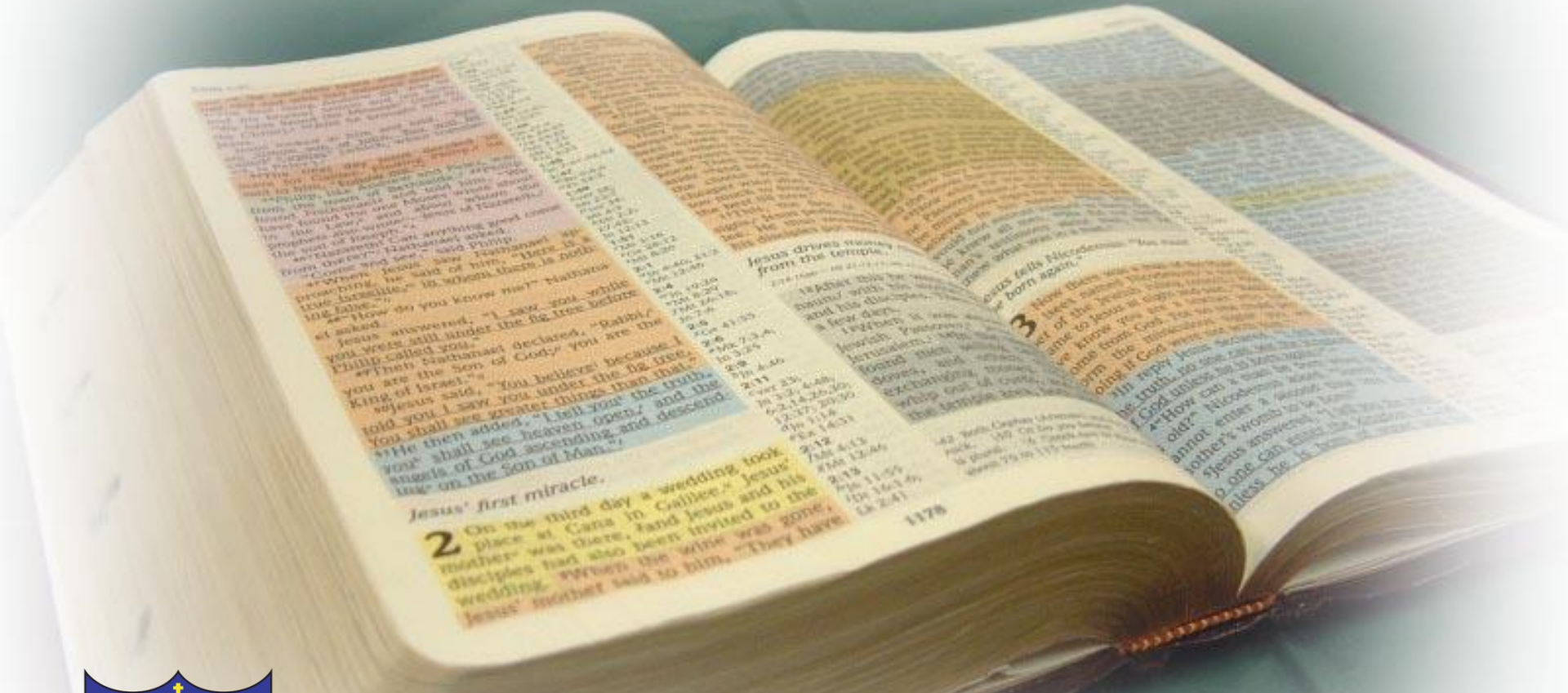


During the Liturgy of the Word we listen to readings from the bible.

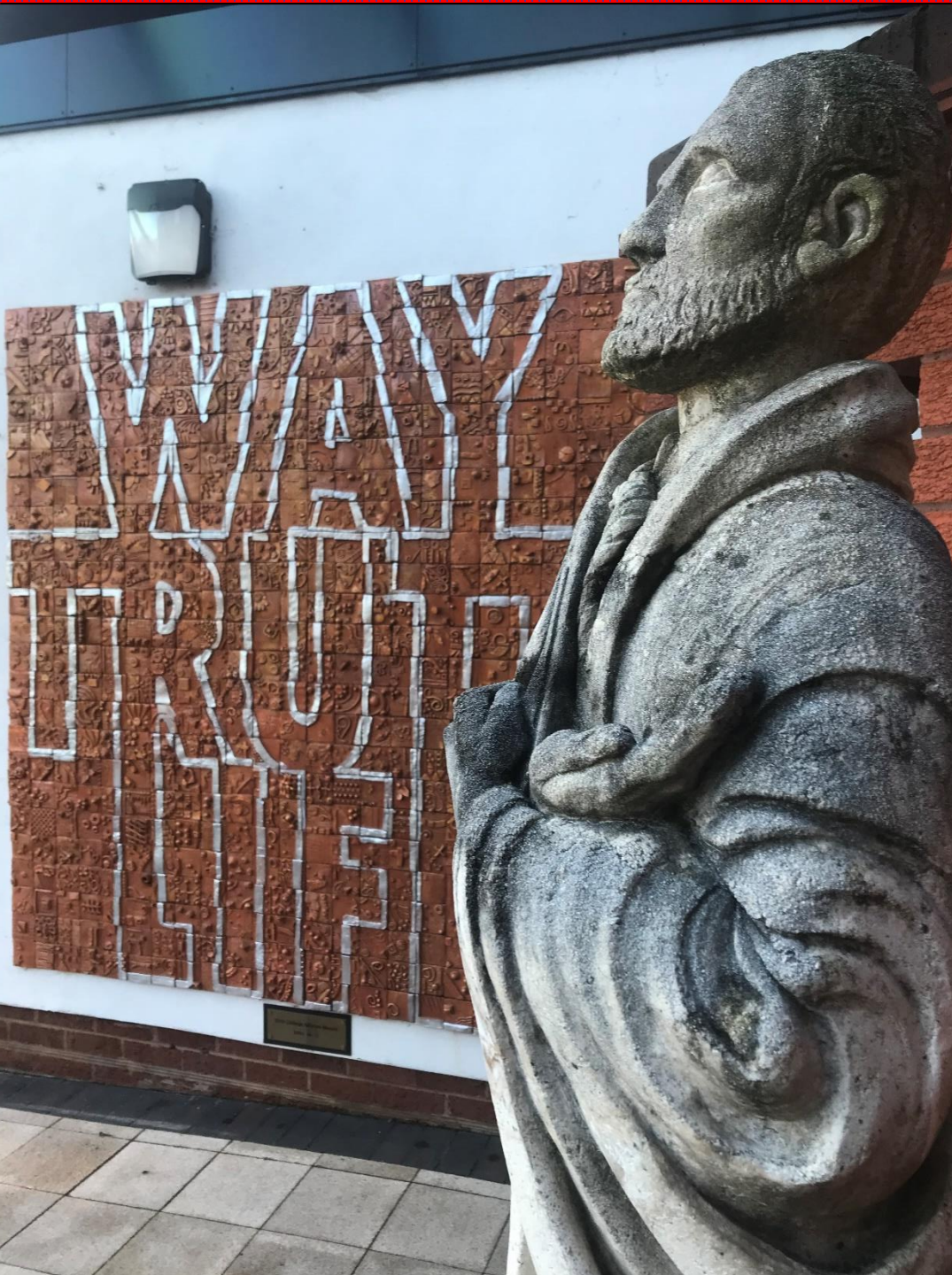


6. We pray for Mary, the Mother of God.

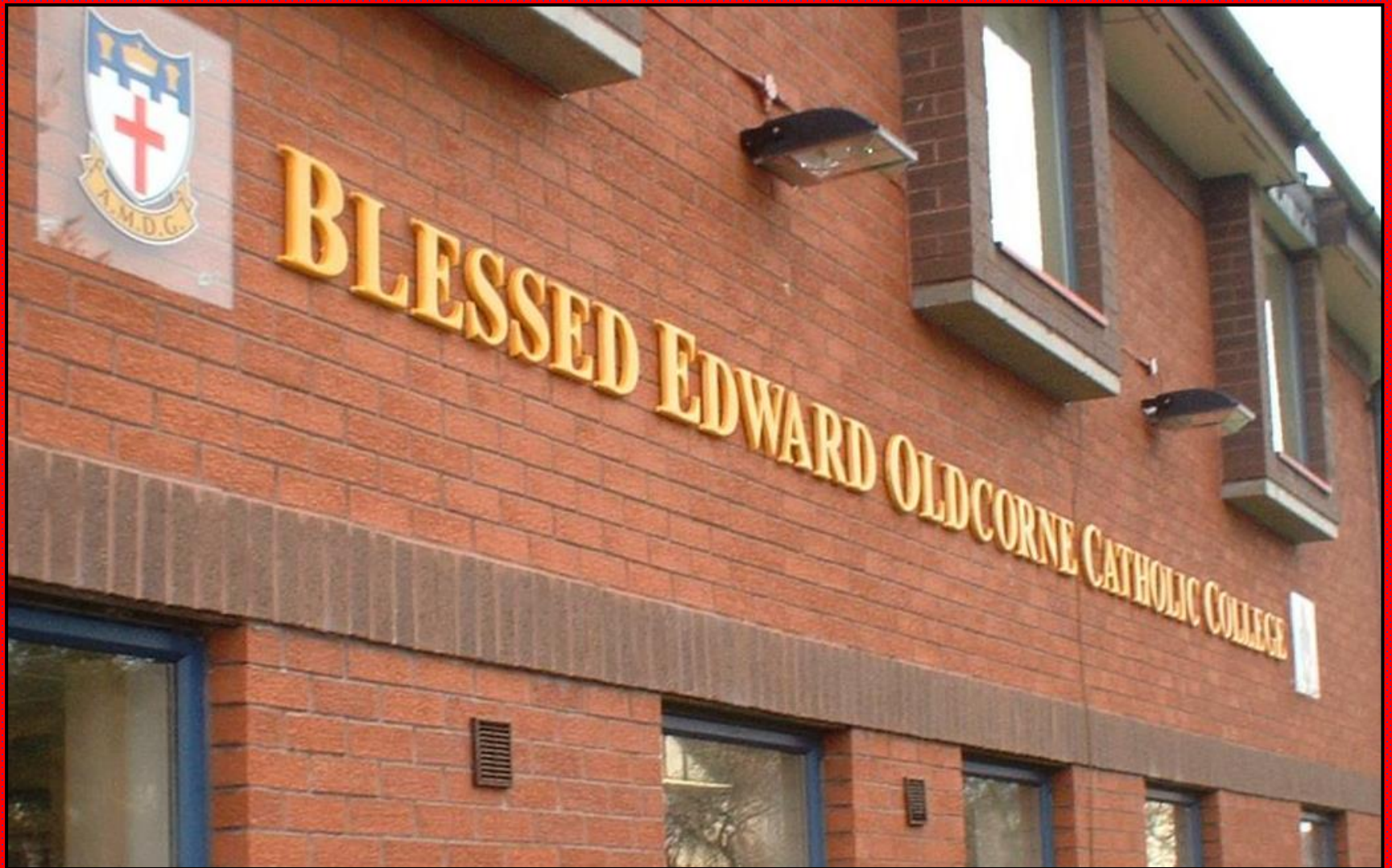

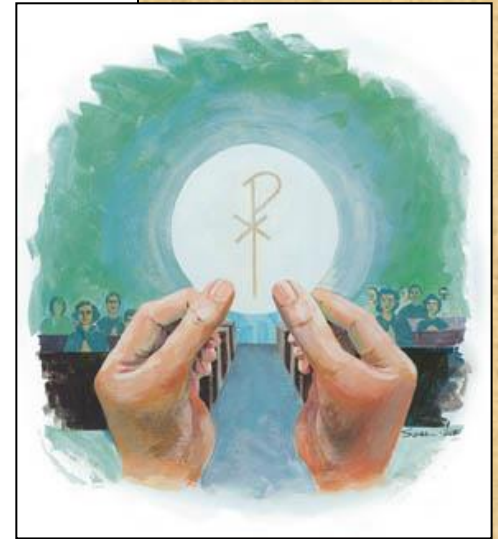

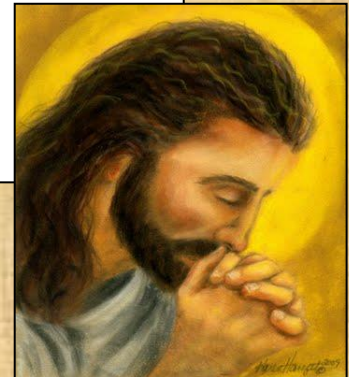


PLEASE STAND

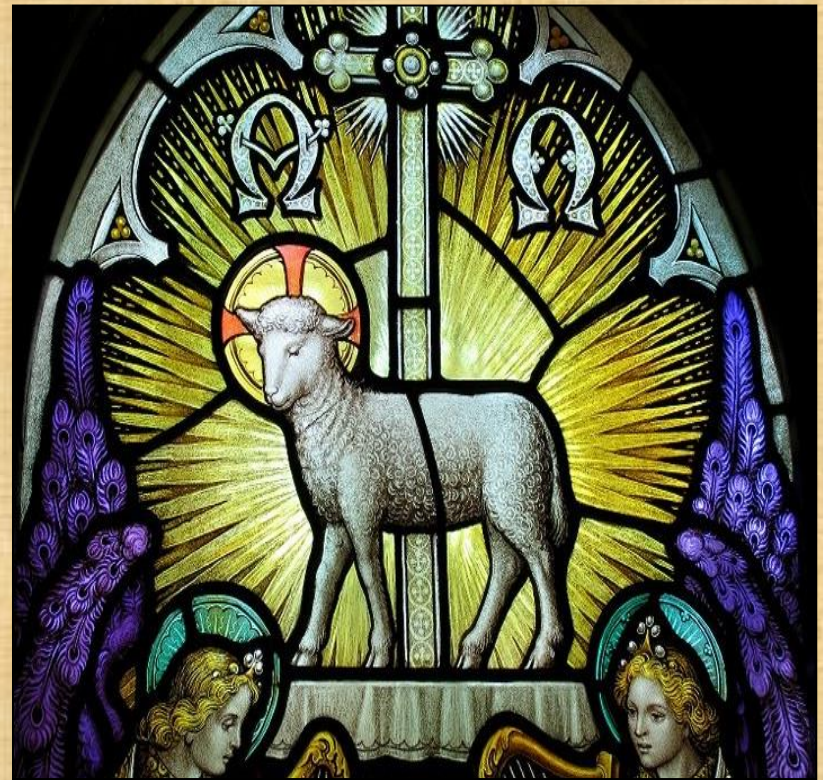

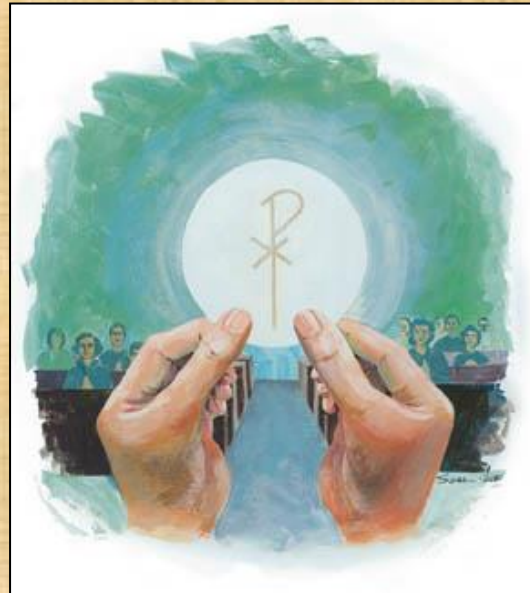

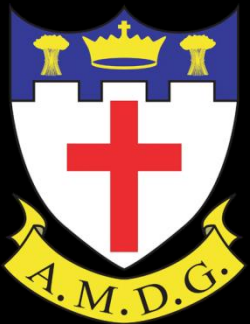


We will now share communion together by either receiving the Body of Jesus or a blessing.

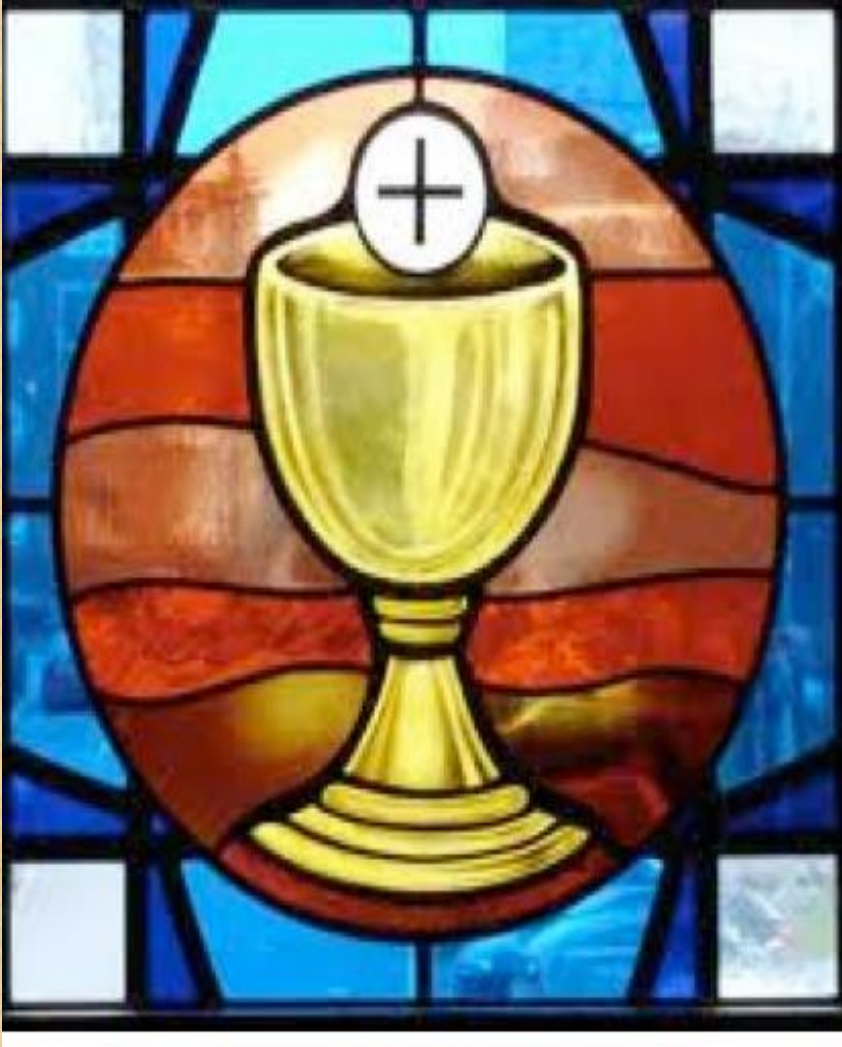
This is a most special time within the Mass and should be treated with great reverence.
