

Year 9 Recall Revision Tips

Your recall test will be broken down into 3 sections and worth 30 marks:

Section A: SPaG 10 marks

Section B: Concept Vocabulary 10 marks

Section C: Literary Terms 10 marks

Nearly all questions are multiple choice or a one-word answer.

You will complete the test in the back of your exercise book.

You teacher might give you a paper copy of the test sheet to look at or use.

Your class teacher will read out the question and choice of answers twice.

You can ask your teacher to go back over a question at the end if you are unsure.

You will have the full lesson to complete the test.

What to revise for Section A SPaG

You will be asked to:

1. Find a noun, adjective, verb and adverb in a sentence.
2. Re-write a sentence with the correct punctuation marks:
 - capital letter, comma and full stop
 - comma in a list
 - colon
 - semi-colon
 - apostrophes
 - speech marks
3. Know when to start a new paragraph
